

JAMES DOUGLAS TRAVER JR. 'Doug' of Medford, NJ, died Tuesday, January 22, 2008 at Virtua West Jersey Hospital in Marlton. He was 59. Doug was born in Glen Ridge, NJ to Marjorie Ross Traver and the late James Douglas Traver, Sr. Doug graduated from Rancocas Valley Regional High School in 1966, attended the US Naval Academy and graduated from Bucknell University where he received a Bachelors Degree in Civil Engineering. Doug has been employed by the Alaimo Group in Mount Holly for the past 37 years. He was a member of the Urban Designers and Environmental Planners, the American Society of Civil Engineers, and the New Jersey Society of Municipal Engineers. He was a Licensed Professional Engineer and a Licensed Professional Planner in the State of New Jersey.
