

Scam email

This is not legit. The IRS has already issued a warning about it.

When the IRS wants to contact a taxpayer, we do so by means of a piece of official correspondence called a "Notice." It is sent by snail mail -- never by e-mail. Moreover, each Notice will be signed by an IRS official (not "Regards, Internal Revenue Service"), and will include the name, title, and phone number of an IRS contact point.
